But the unintended consequence of using this language is everyone thinks you are talking to someone else. When we hear "somebody," we often believe the announcement isn't for us. Such a general plea typically misses the mark because no one hearing it pictures themselves as somebody.

YOU (sitting in the congregation on Sunday mornings; **YOU** at home watching the sermons on Facebook; or **YOU** reading the sermons and announcements on your email -- or reading the monthly THE BEACON newsletter ... **YOU** are the "somebody" we need to help, when and where **YOU** can. At present, we don't have enough bodies to fill all the jobs that need to be undertaken and that may mean **YOU** might have to do "double duty" somewhere to help fill the void.


We need to get out in the community – doing some small projects at first – and that's where YOU come in. Thank You Pastor Melody

Administrative Council

The EUMC Administrative Council met on June 7 at 6:30 PM. The meeting was opened by Sandy Mallory, chair. Pastor Melody led us in prayer.

PRESENT:

Pastor Melody and Denny Olin, Sandy Mallory, Roger & Beth Noonan, Jan Lyon, Aggie Wilson, Jean Peterson, Jim & Gerri Sorbie, Roy Pentilla

Unfinished Business: Sound System: We are still waiting for parts.

Committees/Teams: Sandy asked the Chairs to please schedule 3rd quarter meetings for Fall/Winter planning.

TEAM REPORTSs:

Pastor: Pastor Melody said that communion will continue to be pre-packaged. She said that there will be a worship team meeting tomorrow.

Lay Leader: Jan Lyon asked Pastor Melody if there was anything she needed and if there was any continuing education for her. Pastor Melody stated that she had just completed a week-long vacation and may take a two-week vacation in September. Roy asked if we give communion to homebound people. Pastor Melody said she has never done it. With covid restrictions lifted, she said that she would try to schedule visits. Sandy asked if there was any information about the annual Church Charge Conference. Denny said there is nothing official yet.

Staff Pastor-Parish Relations: Roger had nothing to report.

Finance: Roy gave the financial report. He said that the Endowment Fund is growing nicely. He asked if there would be a Swiss steak dinner this Fall, and consensus was that we are planning on it. Pastor Melody said that she has been paying for the cable service at the parsonage but said that the church is supposed to pay for it. Would the church consider paying this bill? The bill is bundled with church account. Consensus: church will reimburse her Melody will get info to Roy.

Trustees: Jean Peterson said the trustees had met at 5:30 PM. Need to hire an exterminator as there has been signs of bats. Projects being considered from the Bates Memorial Fund are:

- Establish a Roofing Fund for Church/Parsonage. Jean will investigate roofing estimates;
- paving the parking lot;
- solar panels for church roof;
- Patio at the parsonage (Jan will investigate);
- Church front entrance: roof is leaking and causing ceiling damage in the Narthex, front entrance doors need refinishing.

Worship & Nurture:

- Special Music is scheduled with Linda Hickok for 7/18 and 8/15; Wade and Kathy Roskam on 7/25.
- A person is needed to run the sound system. A tentative salary of \$40 for 2 hours for every service is being considered.

Missions: Jim will schedule a meeting 3rd Quarter meeting. The July missions offering will go to Society of St. Andrew and the August offering will go to Glen Lake Schools Student Assistance Fund.

Hospitality: Jan would like people/hosts to get involved. Sandy Mallory asked if we would like to start coffee hour again. Discussion was held about whether to have coffee before worship as well as after. If someone arrives early, they can make coffee for before worship. If someone wants to bring snacks they may do so.

Outreach: Pastor Melody gave examples of things other churches are doing, such as: Kingsley meets on Monday evening for games, crafts, food, etc. Discussion was held about handing out free hot dogs, popsicles, and such at the beach. Or maybe a meal once a month at the church. (continued on next page)



HOW TO RECOGNIZE A STROKE

It only takes a minute. to read this ...

A neurologist says that if he can get to a stroke victim within 3 hours, he can totally reverse the effects of a stroke ...totally. He said the trick was getting a stroke recognized, diagnosed, and then getting the patient medically cared for within 3 hours, which is tough.

RECOGNIZING A STROKE

S ... T ... R ... Read and Learn!

Sometimes symptoms of a stroke are difficult to identify. Unfortunately, the lack of awareness spells disaster. The stroke victim may suffer severe brain damage when people nearby fail to recognize the symptoms of a stroke.

Now doctors say a bystander can recognize a stroke by asking three simple questions:

S *Ask the individual to **SMILE**.

T *Ask the person to TALK and SPEAK A SIMPLE SENTENCE (Coherently)

R *Ask him or her to RAISE BOTH ARMS.

If he or she has trouble with ANY ONE of these tasks, call emergency number immediately and describe the symptoms to the dispatcher.

New Sign of a Stroke ----- Stick out Your Tongue

NOTE: Another 'sign' of a stroke is this: Ask the person to 'stick' out his tongue. If the tongue is 'crooked' [if it goes to one side or the other] that is also an indication of a stroke.
